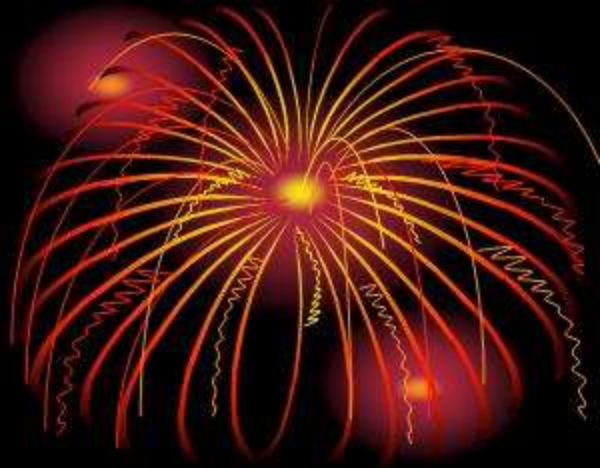

בראשית

The first four words of the Torah are: B'reshiyth bara Elohim et. Which is to say, "In the beginning God created et!", or God created the aleph-bet. Et is an untranslatable word, spelled aleph-tav, but is an abbreviation for the aleph-bet. It indicates that a definite direct object is next, therefore it must come before *the heavens* and *the earth*.

Since God created the aleph-tav before he created anything else, the letters are considered to be the primordial building blocks of all creation. If the letters, or Yeshua, were to depart for even an instant, all creation would disappear into absolute nothingness.

Yeshua is called the aleph-tav, and the aleph has overtones of the "end of days" spoken of in prophecy. The numerical value of the aleph is 1 or 1,000, and each aleph is said to represent 1 day, or 1,000 years. There are six alephs in the first verse of the Torah, and this represents the six days of creation, and also the six thousand years of man's dominion before Yeshua returns to set up His eternal rule.

A Message in the Hebrew Text: *Torah is the rock we should be built on.* God said He declared the end from the beginning: **Isaiah 46:10** "*Declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times the things that are not yet done*". Let's look at the Hebrew and see what we can find from the "beginning."

בראשית

The first word of the Hebrew Bible is: B're'shiyth.

In Hebrew it looks like this: **בְּרֵאשִׁית**

B're'shiyth means "in the beginning" and being read from right to left it is pronounced Breh-sheet.

The amazing thing about this word in Hebrew is when the letter Bet is used first it can mean either "In" or "For" or "By".

The first two letters Bet and Resh means Head of Household in Paleo Hebrew.

Re'shiyth means first, foremost, or firstfruit.

The first three letters form the word "Bara" which means "created". A type of creation that is limited to only God's ability.

Within the first word "In the beginning" we have the phrase "the Head of the Household Created", the phrase "By and for the Head of Household", and also the phrase "By and for the firstfruit"!

From the very beginning we see God so loved the world that he gave His only begotten Son the one who "created" all things to be the "first-fruits" of His creation!

בְּרֵאשִׁית

בְּרֵאשִׁית = In the beginning

בֵּי = House. The enlarged Bet means this is the story of how Elohim (God) is building his house. To start a house (family), a man, the head of the household, takes a bride.

רֵשׁ = Head

בֵּיתֵךְ = Head of household.

In Paleo (ancient) Hebrew it was written like this:



From the very beginning it has been Elohim's plan to build his house by taking a bride and bringing forth his children.

John 1:1-3: *"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made."*





From the very "beginning" we see that Elohim gave Yeshua, the one who created all things, to be the first-fruits and head of his household, his creation!

Colossians 1:18: "Yeshua is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might come to have first place in everything."

Each of the 22 Hebrew letters are *multi-dimensional*. Each letter in ancient (Paleo) Hebrew has a symbolic representation, so there are words within words.

Below are some of the letters and their symbols, names, and meanings:

Words and Concepts Found in the First Word of the Torah

H7225 רֵאשִׁית re'shiyth

= the first, in place, time, order or rank, specifically a *firstfruit*

Yeshua who created all things is the Firstfruits of Creation!

H8352 שֵׁת Sheth, or Seth

= Appointed

Yeshua is also “to be appointed to” death on a tree

H1285 בְּרִית briyth

= A Covenant

Yeshua is also the one who confirms the Covenant

H7716 זֶבֶח sey

= a lamb, a sheep, or a goat

Yeshua is Yahweh’s “gift” to us, the *Lamb of God!*

Words and Concepts Found in the First Word of the Torah

H853 אֶת 'eth [*aleph-tav*]

= used to point out the object of a verb (indicates that a definite direct object is next, therefore it must come before the heavens and the earth.)

Yeshua is the aleph-tav – the direct cause of that which has been created!

H7218 רִאשׁוֹ ro'sh

= the first (in many applications, of place, time, rank, etc.)

Yeshua who created all things is the first, or foremost, in all things!

H7217 רִאשִׁי re'sh [*re'sha* = *my head*]

= The head (chief, head, sum)

Yeshua who created all things is head of all things!

H1254 בָּרָא bara'

= to create (a type of creation that is limited to only God's ability)

Yeshua is the one through whom all things were created!

Words and Concepts Found in the First Word of the Torah

H1265 בְּרוֹשׁ browsh [*normally spelled with a vav בְּרוֹשׁ*]

= a cypress tree (convicted criminals were to be hung to death on a tree)

Yeshua who created all things was hung on a tree, a cross!

H7897 שִׁיִּית shiyth, or **H7898** שַׁיִּית shayithth

= to dress, or place on (*as in a crown of thorns*)

Yeshua who created all things was “dressed” with a crown of thorns!

H1274 בְּרִי briy

= fat (as in a well fed animal fattened for sacrifice)

Yeshua is the final sacrifice, found “guilty” by the priests of the temple!

H1247 בָּרַ bar (*corresponds to the Hebrew H1121 בֶּן ben*)

= Head of household. It later took on the Aramaic meaning of: “a son”

H1323 בַּת bat

= a daughter

Words and Concepts Found in the First Word of the Torah

H1004 בַּיִת bayith

= a house, a dwelling habitation, a temple (*as in “the Father’s House”*)

H376 אִישׁ ‘iysh

= man, husband, steward, champion

H784 אֵשׁ 'esh

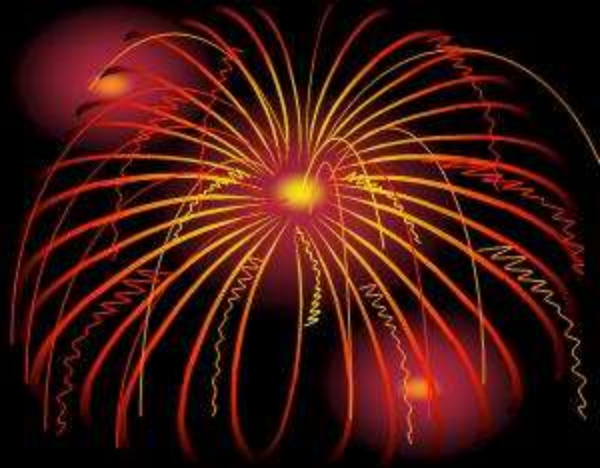
= fire, flames, supernatural fire (*figuratively, God’s fire*)

H800 אִשְׁשָׁה ishshah or **H801** (normally spelled אֵשָׁה)

= My fire, my sacrifice, and is only used in a liturgical sense.
i.e.: A burnt-offering, offering made by fire, a fire offering

**My fire, inside the temple,
would then be written in the Hebrew as:**

The Man, Yeshua

Yeshua is the Stone (Eben) that the builders rejected

The word for father and the Aramaic word for son combine to spell stone!

Isaiah 28:16 "Therefore thus saith the Lord GOD, Behold, I lay in Zion for a foundation a stone, a tried stone, a precious corner stone, a sure foundation."

Father אב ['ab H1]

Son בן [ben H1121]

Stone אבן ['eben H68]

Yeshua is Head (Rosh H7218) of all things

*Ephesians 1:22 "He put all things in subjection under Yeshua's feet, and gave him to be **head** over all things."*

*Genesis 49:26 "The blessings of your father are greater than the blessings of the eternal mountains or the desirable things of the age-old hills. They will be on the **head** of Joseph and on the brow of the prince of his brothers."*

Yeshua is the Creator (Bara ^{H1254}) of all things

*Colossians 1:16-17 "For by him were all things **created**, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him, and for him: And he is before all things, and by him all things consist."*

*Genesis 1:1 "In the beginning God **created** the heavens and the earth."*

Yeshua wears a Crown of Thorns (Shayith ^{H7898}) on his head

John 19:2 "And the soldiers twisted together a crown of thorns and put it on His head, and put a purple robe on Him."

*Genesis 1:1 "In the beginning God **created** the heavens and the earth."*

The Son (Bar) of God (Aleph) is Hung on a Tree as a Gift (Shay)

Ephesians 2:8 *"For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God."*

Gift (Shay H7862) God (Aleph) Son (Bar H1121)

The Son is Pierced (kûr) in his Hands (Yad) and Feet (Regel)

Psalm 22:16 " *They pierced my hands and my feet.*"

Yeshua is the Firstfruit (Reshiyt ^{H7225}) of the Resurrection

1 Corinthians 15:20-23 *"But now is Yeshua risen from the dead, and become the firstfruits of those who are asleep. For since death came by man, the resurrection of the dead also came by man. For as in Adam all die, so also in Yeshua all will be made alive. But each in his own order: Yeshua the first fruits, then those who are Yeshua's, at his coming."*

Leviticus 22:10 *"You are to bring a sheaf of the firstfruits of your harvest to the cohen."*

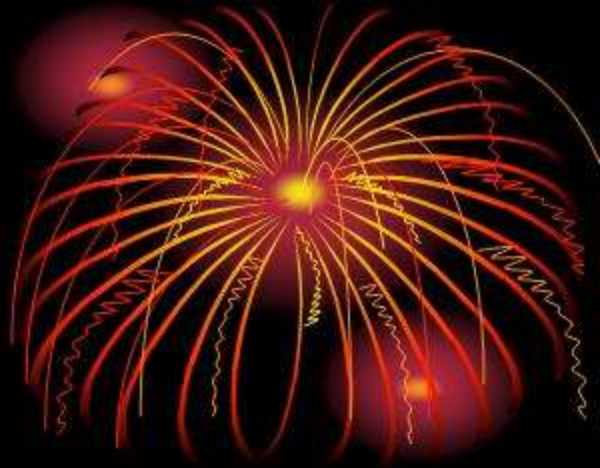

The Important Names all begin with the Yud, the smallest letter,
Not with the Lamed, the largest letter.



The Beginning and The End

The first word of Torah is Be'reshiyt,
And the last word of Torah is Israel.

Reading from right to left, are the letters Lamed Bet, which mean: Control and House, and spell the word leb [H3820 - לב לב], or Heart. The heart controls the house.

The first word of Torah is B'reshiyt,
And the last word of Torah is Israel.

Torah is like a necklace, and a necklace needs a clasp.



בראשית ישראל

The first letter of Torah and the last letter of Torah spell: Leb [H3820 - לב], which means heart. Bet means: house, and lamed means leader, or control.

House Controls

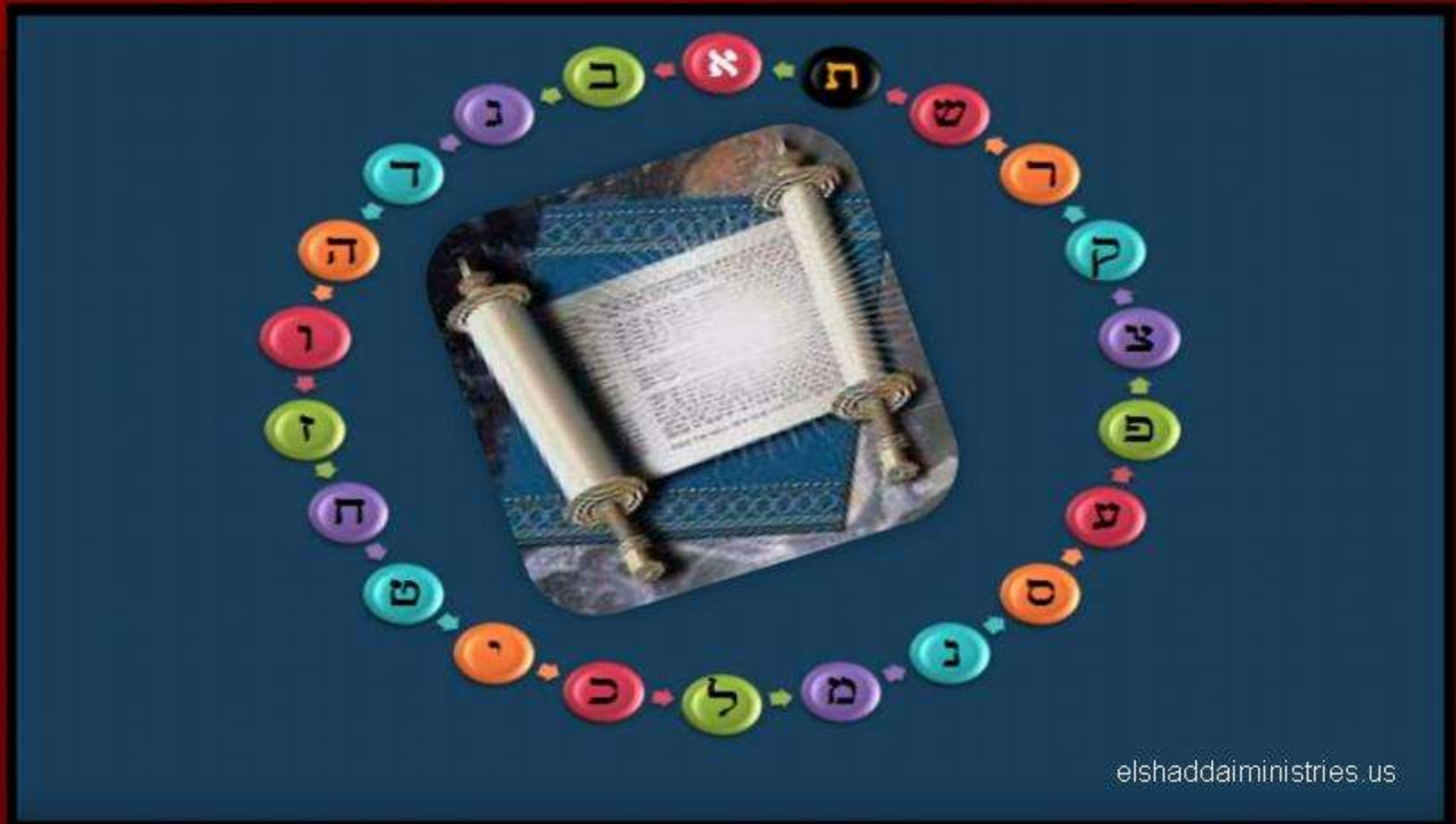


בראשית ישראל

The Aleph-Bex

The Alphabet starts with the Aleph and ends with the Tav.

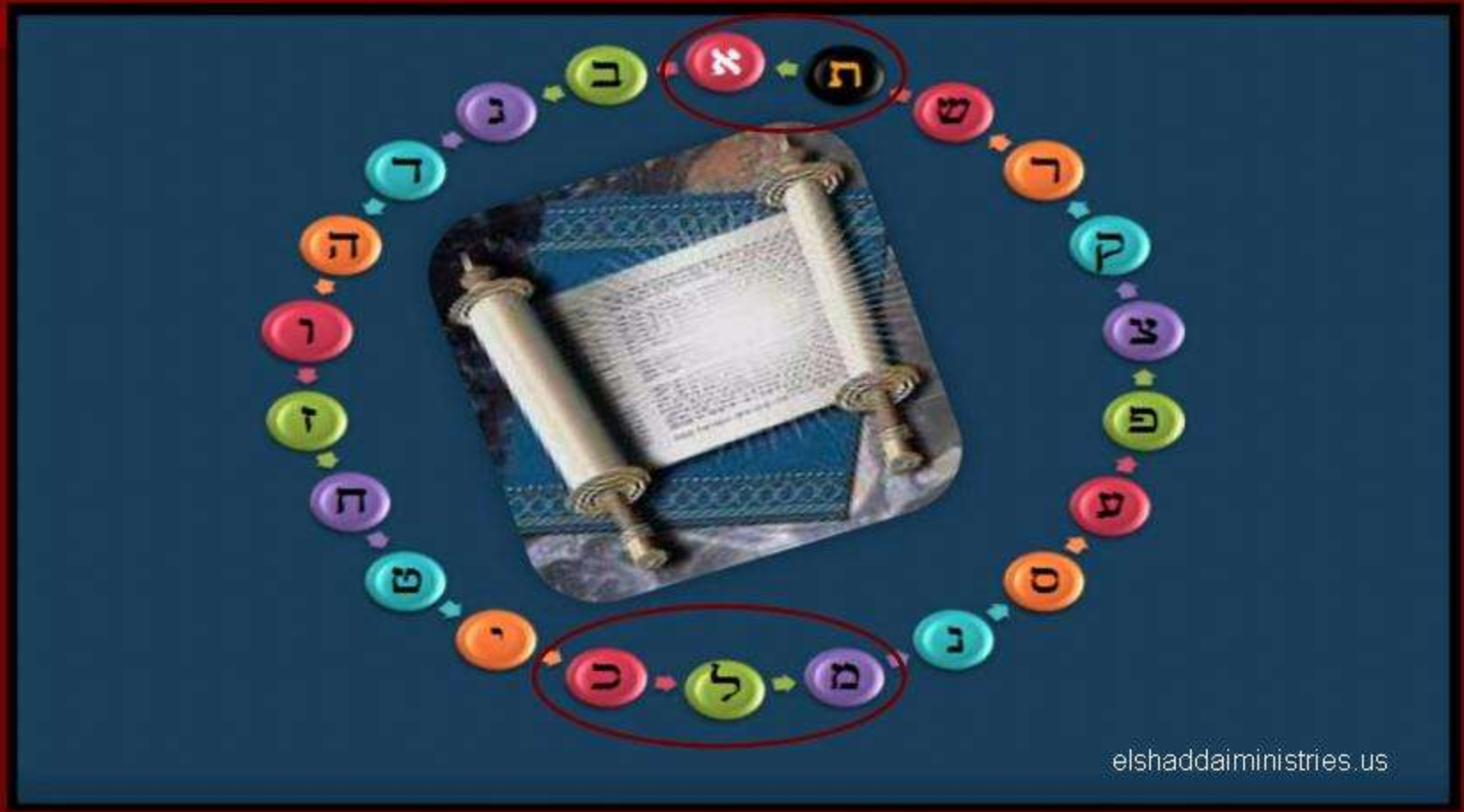


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The Alphabet in Hebrew, like time, is circular.

The Alphabet starts with the Aleph and ends with the Tav.



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In the very center is the Mem, Lamed, and Kaf, which spells Melekh, or King

Think of three of those points being the Mem, Lamed, and Kaf.

The 613 Mitzvot - The Torah - The Light - The Son of Man



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In **Genesis 4**, the scroll says:
Aleph Tav The-Owr – The Light
(Aleph tav – hey aleph vav resh)

Genesis 1:3-4 – “*Elohim said, Let there be light: and there was light. And Elohim saw the light, that it was good: and Elohim divided the light from the darkness.*”



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In **Proverbs 6:23** the scroll says that the Torah is light and **Daniel 7:13** speaks of Yeshua as a son of man.

(Bet tav vav resh hey)

בתורה

(H1247 - bar H8451 – towrah)

Proverbs 6:23 – “*The commandment is a lamp; and the law is light.*”

Daniel 7:13 – “*I saw in the night visions, and, behold, one like the Son of man.*”

The Meaning of Man / Mankind



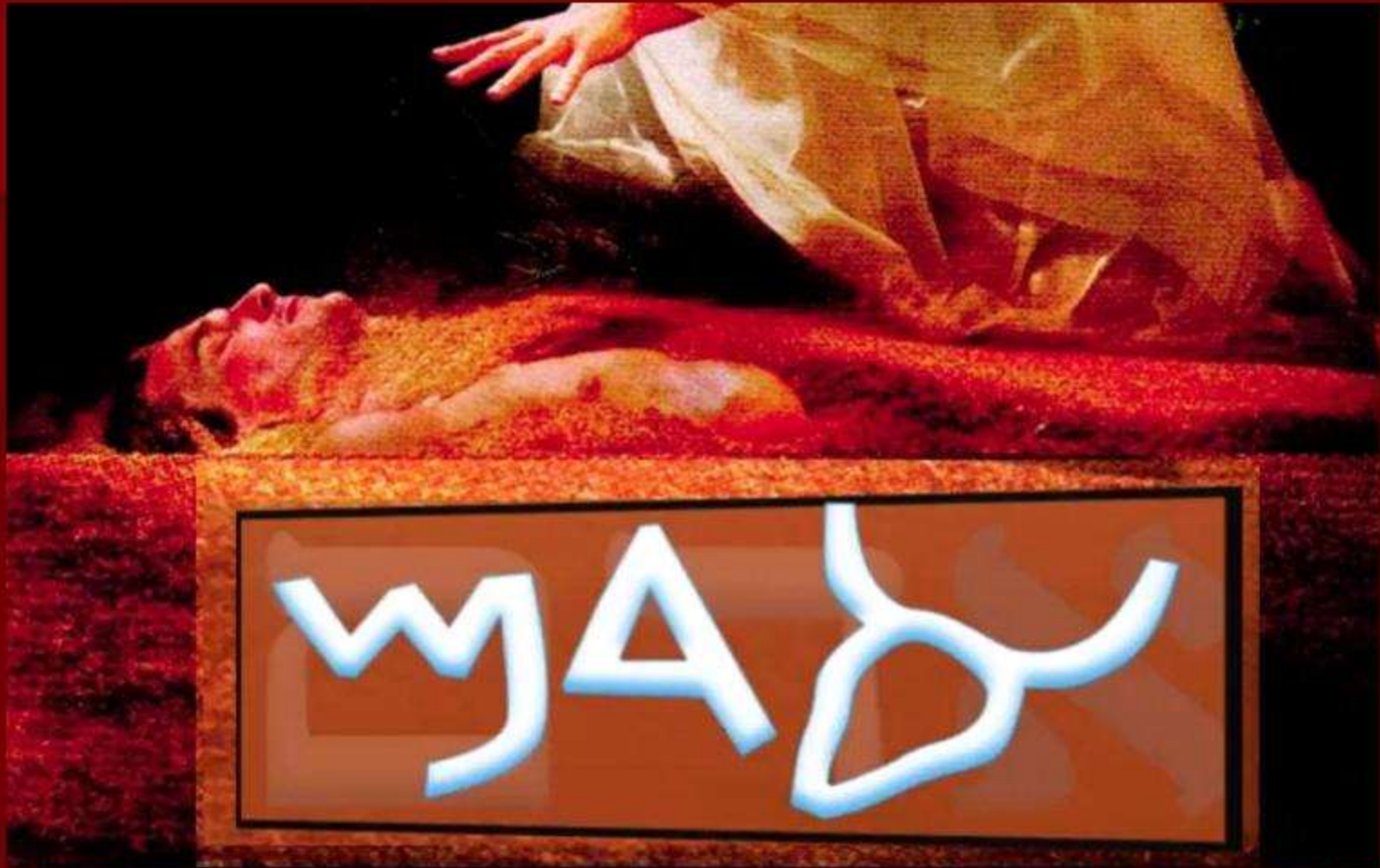
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אָדָמָה

The (Aleph, Dalet, Mem, Hey) signify:

- That we are made in the image an likeness of Yahweh (damah H1819 – דָמָה)
- That we are made in three parts: Body, Soul Spirit ('adam H120 - אָדָם)
- That we are made of earth, dirt, dust ('adamah H127 - אָדָמָה)
- That we are made of blood (dam H1818 - דָם)
- That we are made of water (mem - מֵם)
- That we are just a vapor or a mist (aleph dalet H108 - אָדָלֶת)

The Meaning of Man / Mankind



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In the ancient Paleo-Hebrew,

- Adam becomes the leader who goes through the door into chaos!

Creating Man and Animals



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Genesis 1:7 – “*Then Yahweh Elohim formed adam from the dust of the ground.*”

The word for formed is:

yatsar [H3335 - יָצַר]

Spelled in Hebrew with a **double** Yud

The Double Yud means Elohim used both hands to create the animals



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Genesis 2:19 – “*And out of the ground Yahweh Elohim formed every beast of the field.*”

The word for formed is:

yatsar [H3335 - יָצַר]

Spelled in Hebrew with only a **single** Yud

The Single Yud means, Elohim used only one hand to create the animals

The word for **animal** is:

bēhemah [H929 - בְּהֵמָה],
which means: *It is what it is!*

If you rearrange the letters in the word adam, they can read: môr



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Môr in Hebrew means more.

[H4753 - מֵר]

Man can choose how to live his life.

He can choose to live like an animal, or become more.

Môr is a title of respect in Syriac, literally meaning *'my lord'*.

Y'varekh'kha Yahweh v'yishmerekha

Ya'er Yahweh panav eleikha vichunekka

Yissa Yahweh panav eleikha v'yasem l'kha shalom

Yahweh blesses you, and keeps you;

• Yahweh makes His face shine upon you, and is gracious to you;

• Yahweh lifts up His countenance upon you, and makes you whole.
